- SHDA made the decision to become the official host organization of the Scottish Pavilion at Folkfest. We are now busy filling committee positions, lining up volunteers, and commencing the serious planning, so that we are ready to host this gigantic party for close to 30,000 guests. With this being the 30<sup>th</sup> year for Folkfest, we want to make a real splash. Please consider volunteering for one of the committees – the more brains ... and hands..., the merrier! If you have any ideas for activities, displays, entertainment ... Don't hold back – pass them along to me!
- The Travel Bursary for full members is back. If you travel to a Highland competition or workshop between that takes place between July 1<sup>st</sup> and September 30<sup>th</sup>, and you are a Full Member in good standing, you are eligible to claim reimbursement for a maximum of \$400 in expenses. Qualifying expenses include airfare, gas, dancer's portion of hotel and meals, and registration or entry fees. Receipts are required to support the amounts claimed and must be submitted to our Treasurer, Ronda Bolton. Check the web site for an expense claim form that makes it easy for her and for you!

Whew! That's quite a list of accomplishments for SHDA and its members for the past year, thanks to the efforts of our members and our executive. ## **PROVINCIAL DAY**

“Provincials” are put on by the Saskatchewan Highland Dancing Association which is comprised of representatives from each member local association. To date Saskatoon, Regina, Quill Lake, The Battlefords and Swift Current are members. This year the event was hosted in Regina on Saturday May 2nd.

The Provincial Championships started off the morning. In this competition Premier dancers compete in set age groups for the honour of representing Saskatchewan at the ScotDance Canada Championship Series being held this year in Toronto in July. The top three dancers from each age category are sent to Toronto as our representatives and dance with the best dancers across Canada in the Canadian Inter-Provincial Championships.

From the 16 representatives this year, 7 are from Saskatoon, 8 from Regina and 1 from Watson.

**Pavilion take-down:**

Sunday, August 16<sup>th</sup> – morning to early afternoon, as required

Full members will be contacted to schedule their required Folkfest hours. Remember that this event is one of SHDA's major fundraisers so we all need to pitch in to ensure the success of the Scottish Pavilion. If you are not able to fill all your hours, don't forget to call on relatives or friends to help out – pavilion volunteering is a blast!

## DANCE OUTS

---

There are three upcoming events for which SHDA has been approached to perform, in addition to our Folkfest shows in August:

1. **June 21<sup>st</sup>**, evening. – Celebrate Multi-Culturalism Week by participating in ***Minifest***, Mini Multicultural Folkdance Fest, presented by the German Junior Folk Dancers. A variety of dance groups will perform, followed by a sharing session, where the dancers can learn steps from other performers. There are refreshments, draws, contests, and more. This is an event designed with fun and interaction in mind! The organizers hope that all dancers will stay for the whole event, but you are welcome to dance even if you need to leave once that part of the Minifest is done. Last year, Minifest ran from 6:30 to 9:00 or 9:30 p.m.
2. **July 11<sup>th</sup>**, evening – ***Ancient Echoes Interpretive Centre, Herschel*** – To commemorate the 1859 hunt by the Earl of Southesk, during which he shot a grizzly bear, the Centre is planning a two-day celebration. One part of this is a banquet on July 11<sup>th</sup>, for which they would like to have a half-hour performance of Scottish dancing. There will be an honorarium which could be used to subsidize travel costs for attending this event.
3. **September 12<sup>th</sup>**, evening – ***Mayor's Cultural Gala*** – We have been invited to perform a couple of dances for the 600 – 700 guests who attend this gala at TCU Place, as representatives of Scottish culture. As the organizer explained, she would like a 'wildly exciting' presentation, with dancers of all ages scattered throughout the dinner tables, and live pipes and drums for the Highland Fling. We would love to have **ALL** our members participate in this high-profile event!

I hope to be absolutely inundated with responses so that we can have spectacular displays of Highland Dancing at these events!
