

Muriel Boyle Memorial Awards Scoring Outline

Muriel Boyle was a highland dancer, teacher, and judge in Saskatoon from 1921 to 1954. She was an accomplished competitor, winning numerous medals and awards across Western Canada. Following her competitive dance career, she opened her own dance school, where many of her students also became accomplished highland dancers. In addition, she took an active role in her community by assembling dance shows that could be enjoyed by the public at large. Muriel Boyle directed the Scottish country dancers for 17 years and continued to enjoy and participate in dancing until her passing in 2003.

Upon her passing in July 2003, Muriel Boyle bestowed a gift from her estate upon the Saskatoon Highland Dancing Association. With this gift, she wished to reward Saskatoon highland dancers for their achievements in competition, community service, and the highland dance experience.

Each year, three (3) Muriel Boyle Memorial Awards of **\$350** each will be given to:

- **One (1) pre-Premier dancer** (Primary, Beginner, Novice or Intermediate)
- **One (1) junior Premier dancer** (ages 15 years & under)
- **One (1) senior Premier dancer** (ages 16 years & over)

Applicants must be highland dancers who are current members of the Saskatoon Highland Dancing Association, and who have not received a Muriel Boyle Memorial Award in the past three (3) calendar years. Applicants will be screened by a sub-committee of the Saskatoon Highland Dance Association executive that will be struck specifically for the task of determining the successful applicants for the Awards.

Muriel Boyle Memorial Awards will be presented annually as the Saskatoon Highland Dancing Association February closed competition. Successful applicants will be notified in advance of the competition so they will be present to accept their award.

Each applicant must complete the application form, signed by their dance teacher, and submit it along with the required essay and letter of reference. The application must be in the hands of the SHDA President no later than January 15th.
