Muriel Boyle Memorial Awards

Muriel Boyle was active as an accomplished dancer, teacher, and judge in Saskatoon for many years. She loved to share her love of Highland and Scottish country dancing with the community.

Muriel Boyle bequeathed funds to SHDA to establish an annual award to recognize and reward highland dancers for their efforts in the arenas of competition, community service, and highland dance as a cultural

experience.

Three awards of \$350 are available each year:

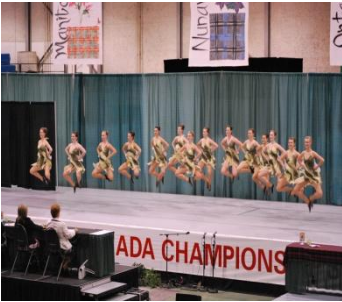
- Pre-Premier [Primary to Intermediate]
- Junior Premier [15 years and under]
- Senior Premier [16 years and over]

Requirements include a listing of dance-out and competition participation, community events involvement, your dance teacher's signature, and a letter of reference. Gentle hint: don't leave the application to the last minute!

Competitions Report
November 2010

Well our last competition we hosted will be difficult to beat now won't it??? I still get goose bumps thinking about how well everything went for our July event. Now that you all have a taste for what Canadians is like you may get addicted to attending this event which means you will be attending more competitions in general to prepare. This is all good because we have 3 exciting competitions for you this year. November 27th, 2010 at the Manhattan Ballroom is where our first one will be held. Check the SHDA website for the entry form. Our February 5th, 2011 will also be held at the Manhattan while our May 28th location has yet to be determined.

Premier dancers ages 16 years and older please note that we are offering cash at ALL our competitions this year!! So dust off your ghillies and get those entry forms in.

Competition Tidbit:

What's the difference between a Competition and a Championship Competition? Good question – the difference is that a championship competition must have approval from Scotland to organize. A Championship competition also has very specific dances with very, very, very specific steps; these steps are called 'championship steps' and these steps are sent out from Scotland every September. The steps change every year but the dances remain the same: Fling, Sword, Seann Truibhas & Reel. At a Championship Competition –

there are 6 place finishes in each age group for each dance. One other factor is that a Championship Competition usually comes with huge, honkin trophies which make for great bragging rights. One other note is that if you ever win a Championship you will have the title 'Champion' for life and thus can never enter a pre-championship competition. So what the heck is a competition? It is a competition where the organizers can choose any dances they like and present any amount of awards they want.

We look forward to having you out at the competitions and remember that many hands make light work so don't forget your volunteer commitment at the competitions. If you do forget – we will remind you.

Dance Outs

As full or associate members you are invited to participate in S.H.D.A. dance outs. Full members are required to participate in three but are welcome to do more. This year we are offering an incentive to do more dance outs: after your required three are completed your name goes in a prize draw. Every dance out over three entitles you to another entry in the draw. There will be draws for prizes throughout the year with the grand prize of an Ipod touch being made at the end of the year. Dance

outs give our dancers an occasion to show off the dances they know and the new ones they learn before they take them to competition.

Dance out programs are not put together necessarily by age, experience or friendships. The primary criteria are that it is a dance known to the dancer, who has the appropriate costume for it. Dance outs are performed for fun, experience, entertainment and the promotion of highland dance.

As the year passes and your dancer learns more dances please let us know. If you are temporarily without a costume for a certain dance, just let us know when you respond to a dance out invitation and we will accommodate.
